"Common Areas to Show your R.O.A.R.":

Classroom

Bus

Programs/Assemblies

Classroom Teachers and Support Staff are responsible for teaching the R.O.A.R. expectations.

First week of School

Students learn the R.O.A.R. expectations at an all school assembly.

Daily

Staff acknowledge individual students showing R.O.A.R. behaviors by giving Panther Points throughout the day. Staff hand out Panther Pays to individual students who are showing the R.O.A.R. expectations. Staff hand out compliment cards to classrooms who show R.O.A.R. behaviors.

Weekly

Classroom teachers conduct classroom meetings.
Common area expectations are reinforced.
Individual and classroom behavior is acknowledged through Panther Points data.

Monthly

Our school wide "PAWSitive" assembly is held the 1st Monday of every month. Pre-K to 2nd go to the Panther Pay store twice a month and 3rd-5th students go to the Panther Pay store one time a month. Classrooms accumulate compliment cards to earn class rewards on a monthly or quarterly basis.

Quarterly

Panther Pride Pod Assemblies are held four times a year. Individual students are recognized for Perfect Attendance, Citizenship, and The Drake Award. Students in 5th grades are also recognized for Honor Roll.



Evaluation and Monitoring

Evaluation and monitoring of the Positive Behavior Intervention Support activities are conducted regularly throughout the school year. By using data, program decisions are revised on an ongoing basis.
